As we move through the month of February, we find ourselves standing at an important spiritual threshold. The season of Lent is drawing near, inviting us to slow down, take an honest look at our hearts, and turn again toward the grace of God. This is a season not of guilt, but of repentance and renewal—a gracious invitation from a loving God. Scripture reminds us: “Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love.” — Joel 2:13

Repentance is more than feeling sorry for our sins. In the biblical sense, repentance means turning around—changing direction and reorienting our lives toward God. It is an act of humility that acknowledges our need for God’s mercy and grace. Repentance opens the door to renewal. When we confess our sins and turn back to the Lord, we are not met with condemnation, but with forgiveness and restoration. As 1 John 1:9 assures us, “If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.” God does not call us to repentance so that we might remain burdened by our past, but so that we may experience new life. Renewal is God’s gracious work in us—cleansing our hearts, restoring our joy, and reshaping us into the likeness of Christ. In the Wesleyan tradition, renewal is closely tied to sanctifying grace—the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit that draws us deeper into holiness and love. God is always at work, inviting us to grow, to let go of what hinders us, and to live more fully in His grace.

As Lent approaches, this is a meaningful time to ask ourselves: Are there areas of my life I need to surrender to God? Have I allowed busyness, distractions, or habits to take priority over my walk with Christ? Where is God inviting me to grow, repent, and be renewed? Spiritual practices such as prayer, fasting, Scripture reading, and acts of mercy help create space for God to work in our hearts. These practices do not earn God’s love—they help us receive it more fully. Repentance and renewal are not journeys we take alone. We walk them together as the Body of Christ—encouraging one another, praying for one another, and reminding each other of God’s unfailing grace. May this season lead us to deeper humility, greater faithfulness, and renewed joy in the Lord.

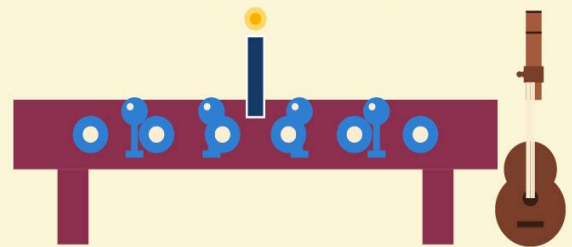
