Dear Frankston Methodist Church,

On January 1st of this year, we officially became a Global Methodist congregation. An aspect of being a Global Methodist Congregation is a renewed return to the foundations that made Methodism fruitful. One such foundation is the practice of discipleship Jesus had modeled. Early in Methodism, eager followers gathered together in very committed and accountable ways to grow in to the likeness of Christ, much like Jesus’ original disciples. Discipleship groups or Covenant groups or life groups became the foundation to grow persons in faith. Without deep formational groups and people around, you and I simply drift off and become vulnerable prey. When Jesus picked his first disciples, he made an instant accountable community. He remade family.

As a new GMC congregation, we are charged with returning to the roots of Methodism. You could convincingly argue we are really returning to the template Jesus laid out in the gospel accounts. The questions aren’t the authenticity of discipleship or its historical roots or its obvious fruitfulness. The question to consider is how do we help the church transition from our current practices to a more authentic practice which is more faithful to biblical practices. You might think of discipleship groups as bulky and intrusive bible studies.

If you were in an original Wesley class meeting or band meeting you would be asked some important questions. I’m going to give you 6 of them. These six questions were asked each week. Everyone in the group new they would be asked and participants would have to give an account. Knowing the questions were coming each person would have to really pray and reflect on their spiritual life. Here they are:

1. Where are you struggling in your spiritual life?
2. Where are you becoming more like Jesus?
3. What might the Spirit be saying to you?
4. Any sin you need to confess?
5. Any secrets you have or anything you desire to keep secret?
6. How is your soul?

Your life will be transformed and your heart will be warmed when you band together in an accountable way. We just entered the season of Lent. It is the perfect season which lends itself to self-denial and refocusing our lives on the practices and disciplines which lead to transformation. Let these questions above sit on your heart. Come see me if you are curious or interested.

FRANKSTON METHODIST CHURCH MISSIONS

When it comes to community service missions, our church is a leader. The following is not to boast, but is information about the way we use some of our resources.

Rainbow House Food Pantry — distributes food monthly, typically on the 4th Tuesday. The pantry is operated under the umbrella of our church, but follows the guidelines of East Texas Food Bank in order to be connected with them as an agency of the Feeding America program. Rainbow House is supported financially by donations from church members, community friends, some businesses and occasional fundraisers. Our church supports Rainbow House by providing space in the Family Life Center and covering the costs of utilities involved. Thanks to food drives held by the Scouts, the school, the Post Office and other organizations, we receive food and dry goods beyond what we purchase from the food bank. Thanks to donations of clothing, blankets, personal items, books, and magazines, we are also able to offer these items to those who come for food. Most months, someone is available to do blood pressure and blood sugar checks for our Rainbow friends while they are waiting for their food. In 2022, the average number of families served was 84 per month, representing an average of 265 people per month.

Teddy Bears for CASA kids — sponsored by the Mission Team, we “bless the bears” donated by church members and present them to CASA of Trinity Valley to pass on to children who are being separated from their families.

Monday Milk Plus — The Dollar General Corporation has joined the “Feeding America” program and donates the refrigerated food that is nearing its expiration date to food pantries. We are receiving milk, juice, yogurt, salads, and other items from the stores in Frankston, Coffee City, and Flint (the store near Brookshire’s). Some weeks, we get a lot; other weeks, we don’t. Since food is still good past the expiration date, we are able to give it to ANYONE who wants it, no qualification or paperwork involved. It is simply here to be shared. If you would like some of this food, it will be available after 2 pm on Mondays. Please call first to make sure we have food available, 903.876.2235. Please tell others about this program. It is sad when the food sits in our ‘fridge and goes too far out of date. That food goes to feed hogs, so at least it is not wasted!

Mobile Pantry Produce Drop — on the 2nd Tuesday of each month, the East Texas Food Bank brings a truckload of produce to hand out to ANYONE who comes to the church parking lot event. 20 -30 volunteers from the community and our church repack the vegetables and load the packages in the cars of those attending. This takes place from 9 am – 11:30 am, no matter the weather (only thunder & lightning will cancel it). Last month, 268 families were served. Please feel free to come and be served and please help spread the word – again it is for anyone, no qualifications! If you would

like to volunteer to help, please call Jennie at the church office, 903.876.2235.

Methodist Men — hold a breakfast meeting on the third Saturday of the month at 8:30 am. Men from the community are invited to attend and share in Christian fellowship. The men also construct wheelchair ramps and may make repairs for those in need.

Frankston Methodist Women — meet at 9 am on the 1st Monday of the month. FMW helps fund various projects for our church and community as well as host an annual Health Fair that is free to attend. The women sponsor the Giving Tree for children’s gifts at Christmas. They provide a meal for the staff of Frankston School and honor the high school seniors with a lunch. Scholarship money is presented to graduating seniors of our church.

Blood Drives — are scheduled with Carter BloodCare throughout the year, providing opportunities to help support the blood supply needed in our area. If you would like to donate, contact Carter or call the office for more information.

Cans for School Supplies — aluminum cans that are collected in the parking lot bin are sold and that money goes to purchase school supplies for students needing help.

Grief Support Group — for those who are experiencing grief from loss of a loved one, break-up of marriage, or other life altering events. Pastor Matt leads the group.

Frankston AA Group — we provide a room in the Family Life Center for the local AA group to meet on Tuesday and Thursday evenings at 7 pm. If you know of someone who needs this help, please pass along this information or suggest they call the church office.

Scouts — we provide a building and utilities for the local Scout troop.

Rest Stop/Red Cross Associate — in case of weather-related evacuations, the Family Life Center is designated as a Red Cross Rest Stop. Families may shower, sleep, and have something to eat. The Red Cross has provided cots, our church members provide all other supplies and volunteer their time to staff the rest stop. We are a Rest Stop only, not set up as an evacuation center for long term residency.

Care Fund — provides help in small increments as needed. Gas cards in the amount of \$20.00 are available; Dairy Queen cards are given to those who are in need of a meal as they pass through our town; financial help with rent, utilities, medical bills; shelter for an overnight for individuals and families in transit, but without means; use of the FLC showers for those without water; other needs may be covered, according to circumstances. A record is kept and payment made directly to the supplier; no cash is handed over to the person being helped.

Dual Credit Scholarship — provides funds to help pay for college credit courses for Frankston high school students.
